- The impact of political revolutions in Europe and America on a newly united 18th-Century Britain;
- The vast social changes accompanying the Industrial Revolution in the 19th Century;
- The effects of the World Wars in the 20th Century;
- The end of Britain as a global empire from the 1940s and the subsequent events that have led Britain to the brink of Brexit in the 21st Century.

You will learn about what Britain and the United Kingdom are, and the country's role in a larger global political stage by looking at political developments, changes in language and literature, and the individual experiences of migrants over the centuries.
